The report includes the wide spectrum of various academic and co-curricular activities of the college.

In the 22<sup>nd</sup> academic year of the institution, the college offers 16 Undergraduate Programmes and 9 Postgraduate Programmes (**Table 1**). For maintaining academic merits, the college keeps on updating its record in NIRF and SWACHH Ranking. In the annals of Sri Kaliswari College, it is remarkable to note that in the third cycle of NAAC Reaccreditation, the college was awarded with 'A' grade with the CGPA 3.11 by the expert committee of NACC, Bangalore. I am happy to register that the institution currently caters to 2261 students representing the rural belt of Southern Tamil Nadu with 60% of girl students and 50% of First Graduation Learners.

## 1. CURRICULUM

For the Empowerment of Student community through Lifelong Learning and Inclusiveness, Outcome Based Education (OBE) system was implemented at SKC in this academic year. To ensure a well-structured education system (i.e. PEOs, POs, COs, Course plan), the curriculum is designed using the constructive alignment approach by all the Departments. To achieve the expected outcomes in Knowledge, Skills and Attitude of the students, Blended Teaching, Learning and innovative Evaluation Methods were adopted.

In addition to the regular curriculum, we also offer 48 job oriented Certificate courses for UG students. Intending to nurture the moral caliber of the students, the College offers Certificate Courses related to Gandhian Philosophy for all the first UG students and select II UG Students. It is a privilege to our college to conduct a Certificate Course titled ‘Safety Matches and Fireworks’ for the past Seventeen years. For PG programme, certificate courses are offered exclusively to prepare the students to appear in National and State Level examination like NET and SET (**Table 2**).

The College has been maintaining its academic excellence and adhering to the academic calendar; the college conducted the examinations and declared the results on time. The consolidated report of the results of the Summative Examinations conducted during April, 2021 is commendable (**Table 3& 3-A**) and the total marks scored by the out-gone students testify to it (**Table 4 & 4-A**).

## **TEACHERS' PROFILE**

The total number of the teaching staff in Sri Kaliswari College is 142. Among them 127 are Assistant Professors, Nine are Associate Professors, Five Guest Lecturers, and One part-time Lecturer. 45 members of the teaching staff are Ph.D. holders, 47 teachers are qualified with NET & SET and 104 hold M.Phil qualification.

Dr.J.Amutha, Head, Department of Tamil, Dr.A.Babu Franklin, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce, Dr.J.Jasmine Bhastina, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce (CS), Dr.N.Saranya, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics, Dr. T. Victor Athisayam , Assistant Professor, Department of Biotechnology and Mr. T Jeyakumaran, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics completed Ph.D in this academic year. Hearty Congratulation to them. Six of our teachers are awaiting PhD viva voce. Two of our teaching faculty are qualified with National Eligibility Test. (**Table 5**). Thirty five of our teaching faculty are pursuing PhD Adding to it, many of our teaching faculty members are pursuing several Online and offline courses to cope up with the expanding horizons of research (**Table 6**).

## **2. FACULTY'S EXPERTISE ENHANCEMENT**

The institution believes that Interactive programmes and scholarly conversation in new areas of knowledge facilitate a greater learning atmosphere and build intellectual ambience.

### **2.1 Funded projects**

I am happy to announce that Department of Tourism and Hotel Administration of our college is approved to conduct "Hunar Se Rozgar Tak" Training Programme under the scheme of Capacity Building for Service Providers by the Ministry of the Central Department of Tourism. Ours is the only college got approval in Virudhunagar District.

The faculty members have been actively engaged in research activities by receiving financial support from UGC and other funding agencies. 24 of our Faculty members have applied for ICSSR Major & Minor research projects (**Table 7**). In addition to it, with the consistent guidance from faculty, 14 students from the Department of Chemistry, 17 II M.Sc. Biotechnology and Botany students and one student from the Department of Commerce have also applied for Students Research Project to TNSCST. (**Table 8**).

### **2.2 Faculty Acting as Resource Persons**

Many of the teaching faculty of our college has rendered service to other educational institutions by serving as Resource Persons and by giving Guest Lecturers in the seminars and

### **2.3 Refresher Course, Faculty Development Programme, Conferences, Seminars attended by Faculty**

During New normal, faculty members were continuously encouraged to participate in Orientation Programmes, Refresher Courses and Faculty Development Programmes to expand their subject expertise. They were motivated to take part in international and national conferences and present papers. (**Table 11 & 12**).

### **2.4 Research Activities**

Knowledge creation, assimilation and dissemination are the key research objectives of SKC. For nurturing vibrant Research Culture among the Faculty members, Research Forums have been established in the Departments and faculty members are encouraged to present papers

in the forums. Research paper presentations on recent trends are followed by interactive sessions (Table 12).

Research efforts of faculty broadly revolve around Publications of research papers in National and International Journals, and as Chapters in Books. The teachers present papers at various conferences and seminars. These continuous and on-going research by faculty members help SKC in building a focussed academic engagement process (Table 13).

### **Publications**

Publication of textbooks by the teaching faculty of Sri Kaliswari College is a regular phenomenon. Five Text Books have been published in this academic year (Table 14). During this academic year our teaching faculty have published 43 research papers in reputed National Journals and Magazines (Table 15).

Through an In-house Peer Reviewed Annual Journal, *Trends in Kalis Research* (ISSN: 0974-70X). SKC provides an excellent opportunity for Research not only for its faculty but also extends its research arena by inviting scholarly papers from other academicians. Dr. Dr.O.Muthiah, Professor, Department of Tamil, Gandhigram Rural Institute, Gandhigram and Dr. G. Baskaran Professor, School of English and Foreign Languages, Gandhigram Rural Institute, Gandhigram are the Peer reviewers. In this year Volume XIII is awaiting its publication. It encases 40 research articles – 20 research articles in Tamil and 20 in English. Subsequently, the journal is made available for wider readership on the college website, ([www.kaliswaricollege.edu.in](http://www.kaliswaricollege.edu.in)).

## **3. SKILL DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES FOR STUDENTS**

Conducting Guest Lectures, Workshops, Seminars and Conferences at the International, National and State level is a regular feature of Sri Kaliswari College to promote intellectual ambience on the campus.

It is my privilege to state that during the Lockdown to facilitate the students, a 60 Days Free Virtual Training Course for the preparation of SET/NET in English exclusively for Net Aspirants, Alumni, UG and PG students was organized by the Department of English.

### **3.1 National Level Conferences**

11 Conferences and Seminars were organized to enhance the skills of the students and also to meet the changing requirements of the industry (Table 16).

- ❖ On 10.02.2022 and 11.02.2022, the IQAC of our College organized a two day national level seminar on “Challenges and Remedies in Online Education in Rural India”. Dr.M.G.Sethuraman, Professor, Department of Chemistry, The Gandhigram Rural Institute, Gandhigram, Dindigul. Dr. Jyothi Pareek, Professor of Computer Science, Gujarat University, Ahmedabad, Gujarat, Dr. R. Haresh, Assistant Professor of

Commerce, Christ University (Deemed to be University), Bangalore and Dr. K. S. Chandrasekar, Dean, Head & Professor, Department of Management Studies, University of Kerala, Kerala were the Chief Guests. Totally 85 research articles by 98 researchers from various institutions were presented in the two day online seminar.

### **3.2 Intra Collegiate Workshops/Debate/Panel Discussion/ Reviews**

All the Departments organized Seminars, Hands on training and Workshops to build deeper conceptual understandings of texts and ideas. To assess and augment their soft skills, debates, group discussions and reviews are conducted regularly. 9 Workshops, Debates, Panel Discussions and Reviews were organized since June 2021 to till date (**Table 17,18,19,20 & 21**).

### **3.3 Industry-Academia Interface and Guest Lectures:**

The College took special care in organizing collaborative programmes and lectures with the experts from the industry on the latest developments in technology and industry. It promoted effective harnessing of the resources, built self-reliance and talent in the students to facilitate greater career options. In order to stay updated with the emerging trends, experts from reputed institutions are invited to deliver Guest Lectures on their area of expertise. During the academic year, 28 of Guest Lectures were organized. (**Table 22**).

### **3.4 MOUs**

It is our proud privilege to state that 46 Memorandum of Understanding are signed with many prestigious Institutions and Industries with the aim of establishing high quality teaching and training to the students' community. In this academic year, five MoUs are newly signed leading educational institution (**Table 23**).

- ❖ MOUs have been signed with Madurai Chapter of CMA and Madurai Chapter of ACS to give Coaching for Professional Course on CMA . The students are given a chance to undergo these courses and to appear for the examinations conducted by CMA Wing of Madurai.
- ❖ Through our professional membership with ICT ACT, Centre of Excellence for Youth Empowerment was established in association with Honeywell.
- ❖ Having tie up with Spoken Tutorial Project, IIT Bombay, online certificate course namely “C ” C++, Python, Arduinio, Avagadru, JMo1, Cell Designer were offered and 2242 students successfully completed the course.

### **3.5 Cluster of Colleges Joint Faculty Programmes**

To encourage the sharing of ideas, data, experience and expertise, the colleges entered into the Virudhunagar District Cluster of Colleges Joint Faculty Programmes. The Departments of Mathematics, English, Physics and Commerce have organized and attended the programmes and got benefitted (Tables 25,26 &27). This collaboration and partnerships add value to the professional development and strengthen the academic profile of the students.

### **3.6 Academic Fests**

Academic and Cultural competitions enabled students to realize their potential, expose their talents and build organizing and leadership skills. Each Department in our college has its own Association which is guided by the faculty advisors and is active throughout the academic year. The Association Activities provide a platform for the students to display their intellectual and creative skills and there by inculcate a sense of confidence in them. Under Associations, Intra-departmental and Inter Departmental competitions were arranged and students are encouraged to participate in it. (Table 28 & 29). Winners of various activities are honoured with Books, Shields and Certificates. Further to develop organizing skills public relations, networking, leadership, mentoring, conflict management and community building Intercollegiate meets have been conducted by the Departments of Computer Applications, English, Mathematics and Commerce and thereby a healthy rapport is being maintained with the nearby colleges (Table 30).

### **3.5 Induction Programme**

Our college organized a Eight Day Induction Programme for the fresh entrants to the UG Programme as per the UGC guidelines before the commencement of the semester classes from 1<sup>st</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> September 2021. A total of 540 students participated in this programme. Entry and Exit level tests were conducted to evaluate their proficiency both in English and in their chosen subjects at the college entry level. Guidance programme was arranged for them on 18.09.2021. Dr.Revathi Subulakshmi, Vice-Principal, Senthamil College, Madurai was the Resource Person.

### **3.6 Industrial visits, Field trips and Excursions**

Industrial exposure training is offered to the students. Fieldtrips are arranged to develop Students' Organising, Questioning, Note-taking and Reporting skills. Through Industrial Visits students get insights on the Internal working environment, Industry Practices and latest technologies. Hence Industrial visits, Field trips and Excursions have been arranged for the students to provide field training. (Table 31 & 32)

### **3.7 Sports and Games**

The Department of Physical Education divided its activities into two broad categories i.e., intramural & extramural. The sports stars of the college have been consistently performing well. Participation and winning in basketball, chess and weightlifting is greatly encouraged. Coaching, Training and fitness classes are systematically organized for the sports teams. The teams participated at various levels like Intercollegiate, Inter zone, District and State Level tournaments throughout the year and bagged prestigious prizes. In addition to that, the physical Education Department initiated the Yoga and the Meditation club to stimulate the students to have balanced mind set up (Table 33 & 34).

#### **Consultancy Services**

We are proud to state that the various Departments of the College render community service by offering consultancy services and the Profit of the earnings from the consultancy service is utilized for the benefit of the students.

- ❖ From 05.07.2021 to 30.07.2021, the CA final, IPCE and Foundation examinations were held at our college. 2,087 Candidates appeared for the examinations.
- ❖ From 05.12.2021 to 20.12.2021, the CA Final, IPCE and Foundation examinations were held at our college. 2515 Candidates appeared for the examinations.
- ❖ The Department of Chemistry has analyzed the quality of chemicals used in fireworks to enhance the quality of products and has earned a revenue of Rs. 22,000 /-by analyzing 51 samples of 14 different Companies (Table 35).
- ❖ The Department of Biotechnology and Botany has prepared Vermi Composting manure, bulky harvest of Mushroom, Honey, Fruits and Greens has earned revenue of Rs.3629/- . Further rendering services to other educational intuitions, they earned total revenue of Rs. 30,700/- . (Table 36 & 37)

#### **4. EXTENSION PROGRAMMES**

Extension activities of our college are integrated with our academic curriculum for which One credit is awarded. The college promotes network with neighbourhood communities through organizing awareness programmes on 'Voting', 'Covid19' , 'Julia Flora Eradication' and 'Sapling Plantation' etc.,. Such extension activities have been carried out in the adopted villages namely

M.Meenakshipuram, A.Meenakshipuram, Vadamallapuram, Annaikuttam and Pavalakurichi for the year 2021-2022. Through extension and outreach programmes, we sensitize the students to develop social values and widen their responsibilities in societal issues and problems by making them to involve with the community people. #### **4.1 Service Programmes**

- As a part of “இல்லம் தேடிக் கல்வி”, Tamil Nadu scheme, Outreach programmes entitled “கல்வி வழிகாட்டி” was carried out by the Departments for the welfares of 6th, 7th, 8th Class students in and around villages of Virudhunagar District from 25.10.2021 to 29.10.2021. The management sponsored stationery kits and lunch to the students.
- “Academic Guidance for Higher Education and Career Guidance Programme were conducted for the +2 students of Government Higher Secondary School, Kallamanaickenpatti, Govt. Higher Secondary School, Vishvanatham and Government Higher Sec. School, Amathur, Sivakasi.
- Blood donation Camp joining with Government Hospital, Sivakasi and Ayurveda Medical Camp with ESI Hospital, Sivakasi were organized.

#### **4.2 National Service Scheme [NSS] - Units Nos.192, 193 & 209**

There are three NSS units (two for boys - Unit Nos.192 & 209 and one for girls – Unit No.193) functioning in our college premises. They are led by enthusiastic and energetic programme officers, who are instrumental in organizing extension activities. The extension activities organized by NSS units like Elimination of Single – use of plastics, Covid Vaccination Camp, Fit Indian Run 75 Programme, Awareness Rally and Celebrating International Yoga Day, Social Justice Day & National Youth Day serve as an eye-opener to the society as well as to the students. They adopt a particular village and render their services to the community under “Village Adoption Programme”. In addition to the above, they carry out activities like campus cleaning and SVEEP Programme (Systematic Voters’ Education and Electoral Participation) (Table 39).

#### **4.3 National Cadet Corps [NCC]**

The NCC Unit of the college had its inception in the year 2021. Among all the Arts and Science Colleges in Tamilnadu under FSFS Scheme, Sri Kaliswari College is the first self-financing institution to get approval with a auctioned strength of 80.

NCC has adopted community development activities with the aim of imbibing amongst cadets' selfless service to the community, dignity of labour, importance of self-help; need to protect the environment and to assist weaker sections of the society in their upliftment. This was envisaged through programmes involving Adult-education, Tree plantation, Blood donation, Awareness Rally, Visit to Old Age Homes, Disaster Management & Relief and Village upliftment and various other social schemes. #### **4.4 Visits to Orphanage and Old Age Home**

- 20 II B.Sc. Maths students visited R.G.M.I. Children's Home, Sivakasi on 02.10.2021. The students motivated the children in the home by narrating moral stories and by conducting games for the inmates. They donated groceries and stationery items worth Rs.6,200/-.

#### **Financial support**

The Kaliswarriors get financial support from the Government, NGOs & various banks (both nationalised and private) from the generous Management (Table 43) and also from other private trusts. Through the Alumni Fund (Table 44) financial support has been extended to the needy students.

#### **6. Infrastructure**

The college meets the requirement of modern educational institution. The college ensures adequate availability of physical infrastructure and ensure its optimal utilization in effective teaching and learning and extracurricular activities. College has smart classrooms with projectors and roll down screens to facilitate teaching beyond the traditional style. The

campus has excellent eco friendly infrastructure, wifi enabled computer lab, spacious and well-furnished classrooms, air-conditioned Conference Hall, fully-equipped Language & Science laboratories, highly modernized & updated computer labs with internet facility, spacious open auditorium, sprawling play ground and excellent gym with all necessary equipments .

The college has two modern state of art seminar rooms, fully air-conditioned, where various academic and cultural events are organized. CCTVs have been installed throughout the college to ensure discipline and safety within the premises. The college has its own RO Plant which provides fresh and uncontaminated water. Further to provide easy banking facilities to all staff and students, Tamilnadu Mercantile Bank branch with ATM centre is placed within the college premises. College has ample space to meet the parking requirements of the staff.

In order to meet the ever growing needs, the magnanimous Management graciously rendered financial assistance for this year too. To provide Police and Army training to the students, a well equipped training centre is setup at the cost of Rs.16, 07,918/- Latest Computers and updated equipments are purchased for the computer laboratories at the cost of Rs.15,00,252/- A new Audio Visual Hall equipped with computer, Projector, Smart board and sound system discharges is setup at the cost of Rs.5,35,000/- For the effective Group Video Conferencing, HD Video Cameras and Audio Speaker Phone are purchased at the cost of Rs. 1,15,498/- A Photo Electric flame photometer device is purchased at the cost of Rs.1,07,380/- and installed at the inorganic chemistry laboratory to determine metal ions. Equipments at the cost of Rs.2,73,778/- are installed at the Biotech & Botany Lab for the phase separation of nanomaterial cooling centrifuge and bench top centrifuge. Two refrigerators are purchased at the cost of Rs. 48,000/- for chemical process cooling and crystallization at Chemistry Laboratory.

To assist the research activities of the students and staff, additional books are added in the central library at the cost of Rs.25,157/- Sports Goods are purchased at the cost of Rs.1,09,355/- To maintain availability and protect data centers from power outages extra UPS are purchased at the cost of Rs. 1,05,905/- At the entrance of the college, a roofing is setup at the cost of Rs. 5,35,000/- To maintain the right temperature at the computer laboratory, an air Conditioner is purchased at the cost of 35,406/-

We thank the noble management for spending enormously to provide ample facility to meet our growing needs.

The placement cell of our college remains a boon to the final year students who go out with a job in their hands after their graduation. The placement centre serves as a foundation for creating diverse career opportunities through continuous counselling and arranging for campus recruitment. This centre creates a meticulous database and assists the students in getting placed in national and multinational companies through campus recruitment. All the reputed organizations including MNCs come to the college for campus recruitment. Placement drives have been carried out throughout the academic year, invites Banking Sectors and Companies like TMB, IDBI Federal Insurance, The English Academy, Aurolab, Corro Health, and Ramraj Cotton Retail. We have been successful in maintaining our high placement statistics over the years and the fact that our students bear the recession blues with record breaking placements which itself is a testimony to our quality.

### **Students Counselling Cell**

It offers counselling service to all the students of the college and makes it available throughout the year. This cell aims to promote a healthy environment and emotional wellbeing of the students (Table 64).

### **Rural Entrepreneurship Development Cell (REDC)**

The Rural Entrepreneurship Development Cell (REDC) encourages student community to take up rural entrepreneurship as their career. The cell undertakes several activities for student development wherein the student gets corporate exposure while studying and develops a spirit of entrepreneurship.
